

Managerial Training and Staff Training

Elder Abuse Issues & Compulsory Reporting Mandates

Managerial training covers the big-picture issues:

- Definitions of abuse and its many forms with real examples.
- Mandates and responsibilities for Managers, Chief Executive Officers, Directors of Nursing under the Protection Bill 2007.
- Considerations of zero tolerance approaches to elder abuse.
- Policy and procedure recommendations in regard to elder abuse policies.
- Criminal record checks, hiring of new employees, preventive measures in the hiring process.
- Legal issues, liability issues, media concerns, duty of care issues, and grey area issues re abuse.
- Dealing with police, protection of crime scene issues, dealing with Quality & Compliance & Accreditation in regard to elder abuse issues.

Staff training includes the following:

- Definitions of elder abuse with real-life examples from Residential Care settings here in Australia.
- Indicators of abuse, neglect, mistreatment, exploitation, psychological abuse, sexual abuse, etc.
- Causative factors of abuse in Residential Care settings.
- Reporting mechanisms under the Protection Bill 2007 - when to report, how to report, grey areas in reporting.
- The police response, evidentiary concerns, protection of the crime scene, what to expect in a court case.

Training Considerations:

- Sessions for residential care staff are usually in 2-hour increments to accommodate your

staffing schedules and availability.

- Managerial sessions are done in 1-hour training blocks.
 - As long as your venue can hold the attendees, there are no maximum limits on the number of attendees.
 - Handouts are given to all attendees.
 - Professional development points are applicable.
 - My requirements as a trainer are simple: a whiteboard and DVD player.
 - My training to staff and managers is very interactive, composed of real stories, not boring dot-point lectures. I use media reports and actual incidents.
